

School of Social Work, Anglophone stream - Francophone stream

Laurentian University's School of Social Work is seeking **six (6) qualified candidates** for its English/Anglophone (BSW & MSW) and French/Francophone programs (BSS & MSS) to begin on July 1, 2017.

Preferred candidates will have a completed doctorate degree in social work, or in a related discipline, with at least one social work degree. Candidates who are currently finishing their doctoral degree and have solid work-related experience will be considered. They will be able to show evidence of an active research program, excellence in teaching at the baccalaureate and Master's levels (campus and/or on-line), undertake thesis supervision at the graduate level and will be expected to contribute to the governance of the school and University as a whole.

Two of the preferred candidates will be qualified to teach in both **French and English**, with one belonging to each program. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and determined according to the collective agreement.

Anglophone Stream

Three (3) tenure track appointments are available for the Anglophone programs at the rank of Assistant Professor.

We are seeking candidates that can contribute scholarly expertise in some of the following areas: social policy and administration, gerontology, mental health, community development, practice with Francophone and newcomer populations, people with disabilities, and in Indigenous social work research and practice.

Francophone stream

Three (3) tenure track appointments are available for its francophone programs; one (1) at the rank of Full or Associate Professor, and two (2) at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The **Full or Associate Professor appointment** will have extensive work-related experience, a strong research profile with grants and publications as well as a solid teaching portfolio in social work or in a related field.

Candidates for the **two (2) Assistant Professor positions** must have skills in one or several of the following areas related to social work: mental health, gerontology, fields of studies related to women, direct intervention, research methods, and the helping relationship. Other fields related to social work could also be considered.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. Laurentian University is committed to equity in employment and encourages applications from all qualified applicants, including women, Aboriginal peoples, members of visible minorities, and persons with disabilities.
