

MOVED, that Senate approve the following policy on auditing courses.

An auditor is a student who is admitted to a course, and may participate in class discussion, but who may not hand in assignments or write examinations. An auditor does not receive University credit for the course.

Students who enrol as auditors so indicate on the normal registration form. The last day to change status from credit to audit or audit to credit is the last day for course changes.

Not all courses can be audited. Courses with more practical and developmental components (e.g. language courses, laboratory courses, activity courses) cannot be audited. The Deans in consultation with departments or schools have the responsibility to designate courses which may or may not be audited.

#### Admission

1. To audit a university course, students must be admissible to the University.
2. Student must have completed prerequisites or their equivalent in order to register as an auditor in any given course.
3. Students may audit no more than the normal number of courses available to students in any one given session.
4. Where such a course would constitute an overload, permission of the Dean or the Director of the Centre for Continuing Education is required.

#### Registration

To register as an auditor, a person must follow the same procedures as those who register in courses for credit.
